Rules and regulations

English performance

- I. Two entries per class, per exhibitor.
- 2. Explanatory 3x5 index card required for each entry.
- 3. Hunter / jumper please indicate if your horse is a hunter or a jumper. Must have a jump.
- 4. Cross country must have a jump.
- 5. English games / gymkhana please give the name of the game and how it is played, timed and judged.
- 6. English Trail An obstacle and pattern is required for arena trail. Not needed for natural trail
- 7. English Pleasure horse should appear to be a pleasure to ride. (a galloping or rearing horse is not a pleasure horse).
- 8. Other English Performance any English activity that is not covered, such as equitation (rider required) or saddleseat.

Western performance

- 1. Two entries per class per exhibitor.
- 2. Explanatory 3x5 index card required for each entry.
- 3. Western stock work require other livestock.
- 4. Western games / gymkhana please give the name of the game and how it is played, timed and judged.
- 5. Western trail An obstacle and pattern is required for arena trail. Not needed for natural trail
- 6. Western Pleasure horse should appear to be a pleasure to ride. (a galloping or rearing horse is not a pleasure horse).
- 7. Other Western Performance any western activity not already covered.

Showmanship

- 1. Two entries per class per exhibitor.
- 2. Explanatory 3x5 index card required for each entry.
- 3. English Showmanship must be shown with an English bridle, a showmanship pattern is required
- 4. Western Showmanship must be shown with a halter, a showmanship pattern is required
- 5. Liberty no tack allowed <u>on</u> the horse but must have at least 1 prop. Horse should be doing something that would not be acceptable in a traditional showmanship class, such as rearing, bucking, balking, etc.
- 6. Creative Showmanship— use your imagination! Make up a wild idea (for example, Pegasus for president) or create a punny horse (ie: a horse fly). You may also exhibit a scene in this class.

Other Performance

- 1. Two entries per class per exhibitor.
- 2. Explanatory 3x5 index card required for each entry.
- 3. Harness Cart optional but harness must fit and be appropriate to use and breed.
- 4. Costume to be judged on originality and theme.
- 5. Parade similar to costume but must have parade tack.
- 6. Other performance any performance that doesn't use English or Western tack (vaulting, etc)

Fun classes - Not eligible for Grand Champion

- 1. Collector display a collection of four or more horses that have something in common. Use a 3x5 card to state your theme. For example a particular mold, breed, color or whatever!
- 2. Theme our theme this year is "Make your own Fantasy Creature". Make your horse or other model animal into any type of other fantasy creature. You cannot start with a unicorn or Pegasus. Use a 3x5 card to tell about your creature.
- 3. Pet Use a 3x5 card to explain what breed your pet is and what it is doing.
- 4. Livestock Please tell us on a 3x5 card what breed your livestock is and what it is doing.
- 5. Wildlife Please explain on a 3x5 card what your species is and its attributes.

Color

- 1. A horse may enter only one class.
- 2. Two entries per class per exhibitor.
- 3. Judge has right to move horses to another class if the feel that the horse is in the wrong class.

Breed classes

- 1. Appaloosas need at least two characteristics of their breed to enter (mottled skin, spots, sclera around eye, striped hooves, etc.)
- 2. American gaited will only accept breeds that were developed in America.
- 3. Draft includes purebreds and any crosses thought to be a draft breed.
- 4. Morgan includes all types of its breed.
- 5. Paint horses need not be registered in APHA to enter, however, the horse needs to be at least 50% paint horse crossed only with Thoroughbred or Quarter Horse.
- 6. Pony classes will accept any purebred under 14.3 hh with the exception of the American Miniature Horse.
- 7. Quarter Horse includes Canadian Cutters, Australian Stock Horse and other variations.
- 8. Spanish bred classes include breeds from South America, Spain and Mexico.
- 9. All Standardbreds must have their gait (trotter or pacer) on the leg tag.
- 10. Thoroughbreds of all nationalities are welcome.
- 11. Warmblood includes any sport horses that fit in that category.
- 12. Other purebreds that do not fit in the other categories can enter class 51.
- 13. Customized/Artist Resin class incudes all horses that were altered from the factory finish and those hand-molded by a private artist.
- 14. Judges may reassign horses to appropriate classes if mix up's occur. If you are not certain which class to enter a horse in, please ask a show official.
- 15. Classes with an * need to have a specific breed named on the leg tag.

General show rules

- 1. The entry fee is \$15.00 for unlimited classes if received by 2/28. Day of show entries accepted with \$20 entry fee. Maximum of \$25 per family by 2/28 or \$30 day of show. Please make checks out to "4-H Horse Advisory". Cash is acceptable too.

- 3. Please call me with any questions at 518-672-1071 or email kelseymjenks@hotmail.com. Feel free to call if you are new to model horse showing and we will help you get started.
- 4. Please make every effort to get your entry in by February 28, so we can assign exhibitor #'s and you can get your legs tags all done before the show. If you have a Region 10 #, let us know what it is and we will assign you that # for this show. You do NOT have to send in a list of your horses or what classes they are in before the show but you should have your show worksheet completed before the show so you are organized and ready for your classes.

- 5. This is a <u>youth</u> show! Parents are not allowed to help once the child is standing at the show table (with the exception of children under the age of 10). It is crucial to the learning experience that we have made this rule and also out of fairness to the other competitors.
- 6. Youth 5-19 are permitted to participate. 4-H membership is not required.
- 7. Unsportsmanlike behavior or behavior that deviates from the 4-H Code of Conduct from any person will not be tolerated. You will be asked to leave.
- 8. For every non-perishable item you bring, you will receive one free raffle ticket. This is not required as there will also be raffle tickets for sale.
- 9. Bring a bagged lunch and be prepared to stay all day.
- 10. Be respectful of the judges since they are volunteering their time to judge our show. The decision of the judges is final.
- 11. Do not touch someone else's horse unless they have given you permission.
- 12. No smoking in the building.
- 13. PLEASE!! NO RUNNING!! These horses are very delicate and susceptible to tipping over. One bump to a table could cause a lot of damage to a child's herd.

Ribbons

Flat ribbons 1-6 will be awarded for each class.

Champion and reserve rosettes will be awarded for all divisions except for "fun". This will be based on points earned in the division and the judges' discretion.

Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be awarded rosettes and trophies.

The points of place earnings are as follows: $1^{st} = 6$ points, $2^{nd} = 4$ points, $3^{rd} = 3$ points, $4^{th} = 2$ points, $5^{th} = 1$ points and $6^{th} = 0$ points.

Entering your horse

Pre-entry is encouraged so you have your exhibitor # to put on your leg tags before the show.

The entry form is enclosed in this packet or email

Each horse entered must have a string tag on its right hind leg. Have these tags filled out ahead of time so all you have to do is add your exhibitor # when you get it. The tag should read as follows:

Front top left: Exhibitor # (we will assign these when we get your entry)

Front top right: Horse Letter (from show worksheet)

Front bottom: Horse's breed Back top: Horses' name Back bottom: Your initials
