Families may enter for the \$50.00 entry plus \$40.00 for each additional family member under the age of 18 showing in the open division.

Proxy Showing

Proxy showing is available for a \$5.00 registration fee and \$2.00 per horse up to 17 horses. More than 17 horses may be shown (18-50) for the \$50.00 entry fee.

Open Division entry fee includes all open divisions and entry for **50** horses. Novice Division entry fee includes the Novice Division only and entry for **30** horses. Novice entrants cannot cross-enter in the Open Division. Lunch will be available to purchase on premises if desired, or there are fast food restaurants nearby. At least ½ of a standard table is included. Please bring your own tablecloth.

Donations:

Any donations for door prizes or raffles are gratefully accepted. If the show hostess is notified of or receives donations before May 20th, donators will receive a free full-page ad in the show program.

Awards: Custom designed paper ribbons 1st- 6th, custom commercial rosettes for all sectional champions and Top 10's for Breed and Collectability/Workmanship.

Lilac City Live has applied for NAMSHA membership for the open classes. If approved, entries that place either first or second in any of the Open Divisions will earn qualifications to NAN 2017/2020. Please refer to www.namsha.org.

Entries that place either first or second at this show will be eligible to compete at the next TRXC. Visit www.regionxnation.com for further information.

Halter Class Guidelines

Entrants may show up to three horses per halter class. Additional horses may be entered for \$1.00 per horse. Place the horse and the dollar on the table. The show hostess will collect the dollars. Halter classes will be double-judged for breed standards and either collectibility or workmanship. This means that for halter classes,

horses can potentially win two ribbons in the same class – one for breed and one for collectibility or workmanship.

1. Halters are optional for breed classes. If you do use a halter, be sure it is correct for the breed and fits the model correctly.
2. One breed class per horse.
3. Short paragraphs and reference photos are encouraged for rare breeds. Size not to exceed 8 ½ x 11 inches. Please do not place books on the table.
4. Index cards and COA's are **STRONGLY** encouraged for collectability. Index cards are *****required**** for Stone horses. If you want your Stone horse considered for collectibility you must provide an index card stating what the model is. A good reference site for Stones is www.stonehorseref.com

Original Finish – is defined as any model that is mass-produced at a factory (i.e. Breyer, Stone, Hartland) and has not been altered in any way after leaving the factory. This includes but is not limited to the use of spray polish, applying black polish to hooves, or adding a glossy finish to a matte model. Touch-ups are permitted if not obvious.

Custom Models – are defined as any model that has been changed from its original form in any media. These classes also include models made by hand.

Artist Resins – are defined as any model, regardless of number in run, which has been home or professionally cast. Original Sculptures also qualify for the resin division. Resins that have been altered after casting still enter the resin classes.

OF China – any factory produced china, porcelain, cold-cast porcelain, or resin models show in the china division. This includes Hagen –Renaker, Japan chinas, OF Breyer porcelains, North Lights, BHR resins, Border Fine Arts, the Starlite Collection, and H&H Winner's Circle OF Resin Line.

CM Glazed China - any china horse that has been altered from its original finish by firing a permanent glaze onto the horse, or uniquely glazed by the factory, sculptor or another artist in a color not released in a regular edition. Cold-painted china or mass-produced resin horses belong in the Custom division.

PERFORMANCE CLASS GUIDELINES

Entrants may show up to two entries per performance class. For any set-up with more than one horse – tag only ONE horse. This horse will be listed in the results and will be the horse to earn the NAN qualification. The remaining horses are considered props.

1. All classes (except pleasure classes) **MUST** have a card explaining what the model is doing. If there is no card with the entry, it will not be judged.
2. Riders/handlers are optional
3. Do not use any solid backgrounds. The horse must be visible from all sides.
4. Calf/animal is required for any stock work.
5. Cart and driver are optional for harness.
6. State level and movement for dressage.
7. State type of outfit for costume

FANTASY/DECORATOR CLASSES

Only equine based fantasy & decorator models can enter. **As the NAMHSA rules states only equine based "Pegasi" & "Unicorns" or combinations of the two are eligible to earn NAN cards in collectability & workmanship. Decorator models are also eligible to earn NAN cards in collectability & workmanship.**

1st & 2nd place models will earn Region 10 cards in collectability & workmanship. Models in these classes that win first & second place for collectability & workmanship will earn NAN cards. Fantasy models are eligible for collectability / workmanship call backs & champ/res.

Unicorns, Pegasus & decorators will be judged for collectability & workmanship only.

The NAMHSA Board of Directors has voted to allow certain Fantasy Equines to compete for and earn Non-Breed Halter (Collectibility or Workmanship) NAN cards and be eligible to show at NAN. Eligibility would be limited to equine-based "unicorns" and "pegasi" (or a combination of the two) only. For the purposes of this proposal, a "unicorn" is defined as an equine with a single horn attached at or near the forehead. A "pegasus" is defined as an equine with wings attached at or near the shoulders. Wings can be of any type found in nature, and will not be limited to bird-like only. Eligible animals will basically be equine in nature, with an equine head, neck, body, and legs. Goat-based or half-equine creatures will not be eligible. The head and body must remain equine in form. Hooves can be equine or cloven, tails can be of any type, and extra hair, scales, feathers, or other textures on the head and/or body are permitted, so long as the head and body are still equine in form. Sculptures can be realistically colored or decorators. The base equine can be any equine--horse, pony, donkey, mule, zebra--of any breed type, with no stated preference given to one type over the other.

OF models will be judged based on collectibility criteria already outlined on the NAMHSA website and in the NAN packet.

CM/AR entries will be judged based on artistry of the sculpture, lack of prepping and painting flaws, and proper equine biomechanics of the head, neck, body, and legs. Wings and horns will be judged based on the skill and artistry with which they are added to the equine. Whether or not it looks as though the animal can fly will not be stated criteria for judging. These are imaginary creatures, after all, and, just as there are flightless birds, so, too, can there be flightless winged equines.

TAGS

Lilac City Live will be using the Region 10 Tag Manager system to track entrant horses and generate results. Please visit <http://tags.annsmoels.com/> to enter your horse list. You can also use the system to print labels for your tags. Horses **MUST** be entered into the system prior to the start of the show. I will be using this system to generate the results for the show.

Each shower is responsible for creating their own tags. Avery tags #11062 or equivalent (1 3/4" to 1 3/32" in size) white and stringed should be used. These can be found at any office supply store.

To get a shower number you must contact the "keeper of the numbers", Jackie Arns at drsteggy@drsteggy.com. In your email put your name and email address and request a Region 10 exhibitor number.

HORSE LIST

Please turn in your horse list made on the Region Ten Tag Manager on the day of the show. *Please list horses in numerical order.* The only horse list accepted is your printed out horse list from the Region Ten Tag Manager. Be sure that all horses you will be showing have been added to your horse list on the Region 10 Tag Manager **BEFORE** the show.

Division Running Order

China and both performance divisions will start first thing in the morning. After those divisions are done (around lunch time/early afternoon) AR/CM halter and OF halter will start.

DIRECTIONS:

From the west: Take the NY State Thruway (I-90) to the LeRoy exit #47. Exit onto Route 19 North (I-490 exit #1 towards LeRoy/Brockport). Turn slight right onto NY-19 and continue on route 19/Lake Road towards Brockport. Turn right onto NY-31/Brockport Spencerport Road. Turn left onto route 260/Sweden Walker Road at the traffic light. There will be a Byrne Dairy convenience store/gas station on the corner. The Elks Lodge is the huge building on the right shortly after you turn.

From the east: Take the NY State Thruway (I-90) to the Rochester exit #45. This is the first Rochester exit. Exit onto Route 490. You'll take 490 directly through downtown Rochester (all expressway). Once on the west side of the city you'll pass the 390 off ramp and stay on 490. About a mile after passing 390 you'll come to Route 531 west. Get on 531. 490 & 531 Y off, stay to the right & get onto 531. Take 531 to the end (about 5 miles or so). When 531 ends turn right. Once you turn get into the left lane, go maybe 100 yards to the traffic light & turn left onto Route 31. Go down about 2 miles to the next traffic light & turn right onto Sweden Walker Road / Route 260 (Byrne Dairy convenience store / gas station on the corner). The Elks lodge is the huge building on the right shortly after you turn.

From the south: Take route 390 north towards Rochester, to route 490. Get on 490 & take for a short stretch (maybe a mile) to 531. Get on 531. 490 & 531 Y off, stay to the right & get onto 531. Take 531 to the end (about a 5 miles or so). When 531 ends turn right. Once you turn get into the left lane, go maybe 100 yards to the traffic light & turn left onto Route 31. Go down about 2 miles to the next traffic light & turn right onto Sweden Walker Road / Route 260 (Byrne Dairy convenience store / gas station on the corner). The Elks lodge is the huge building on the right shortly after you turn.
