Hall Access

The show hall will open at 7:30 am both days, judging will begin promptly at 9:00am. There will be no access to the hall Friday night. Showers may leave items in the hall Saturday night, but it is strongly recommended that valuables not be left out of a shower's control. Due to an unfortunate incident at another event in a locked hall, the show holder and hotel cannot recommend leaving valuables unattended overnight. The show holder and hotel are not responsible for lost or stolen items.

Show Hall

The show hall is on the second floor of the hotel, above the main lobby. There is an elevator in the main lobby that opens directly adjacent to the entrance of the show hall. The lobby and elevator can be accessed from the front entrance of the hotel under the overhang but vehicles may not be left in this area for an extended period. If you are going to unload in this location please do so promptly. There are several handicap accessible parking spaces near this entrance. Other parking spots in this area are limited – those marked as "For Tavallo Only" could be used briefly to unload in the morning as Tavallo does not open until 11:00 am. Please move your car to the rear parking lot immediately after unloading. Alternatively, the lobby can be accessed from the rear parking lot, but it is a slightly longer walk. For those not in need of the elevator, there are stairs near the rear entrance that lead directly to the show hall area.

Tables

This facility has 6'x2' tables. Regular entry fees will include 1 of these tables with 2 tables grouped together with one shower on each side, each with their own table and, For an additional \$20 per day there will be a limited number of "2 table sets" that may be reserved by one shower, providing 4'x6' of total table space.

Host Hotel

A block of rooms has been reserved at a group rate of \$139/night – this can be reserved using the link below – note that rooms MUST be reserved by October 4, 2023 to get the block rate.

Transportation Availability

One of the unique things about this host hotel is it is located at the main transportation hub for Rhode Island. TF Green Airport (PVD) is located directly across the street from the hotel, the train nearby, and buses service the airport as well. The hotel has a free 24-hour shuttle available to/from the airport. The airport rental car facility (connected to the airport via overhead skybridge with moving walkways) is serviced by MBTA Commuter Rail “Providence/Stoughton Line” – if taking Amtrak, it would be necessary to disembark in Providence and transfer to the MBTA to get to the TF Green MBTA stop. Also note that the nearest port for the Cross Sound Ferry from Orient Point Long Island is New London, CT – about an hour by car to the hotel or directly accessible to Amtrak. Bottom Line – there are numerous options to get to the show beyond car travel – if you would like to explore options, please contact the show hostess for more information.

Lunch

The optional boxed lunch includes: choice of either Turkey & Cheddar on a mini Croissant OR Grilled Veggie Wrap. Each lunch also comes with Pasta Primavera, Chips, Brownie, and Bottled Water for \$33 and must be ordered/paid in advance.

This is provided by the hotel, and yes, it is expensive, but we are fortunate that the hotel has NOT imposed a food and drink minimum which would have added to the total cost of the show/entry fees if we were at another hotel. This boxed lunch is an option for those that do not wish to leave the hotel to find food or bring their own lunch and would like to overall support the show/hall. While entrants are allowed to bring food into the show hall, bringing in outside catering is not allowed – you may team up with a friend to bring back take out, but I ask that you not have delivery of nor bring in “catered type group orders” (ie: whole pizzas) as this is outside of what the hotel has asked and will probably get us booted from the hotel – we are lucky to not be told that no outside food at all is allowed as that has been the case at other events.

Additional lunch options nearby are:

Tavalo located in the same parking lot with the hotel and has Italian food – on-line ordering/take out is available (note this is a somewhat upscale restaurant)

Wendy’s is the closest fast food about 2 blocks away. There is a Chipotle and KFC within about a mile.

Overall this is a very busy area – a quick search will show numerous options within 5 miles.

Saturday Night Pizza Party

The traditional pizza party will take place at Bertucci’s, which is about a block from the hotel, starting at 6:30 Saturday evening. The group buffet will include assorted pizza, salad, soda, and dessert. \$21 per person (yes, this is a price hike as well – inflation). You need to reserve/pay in advance.

Tags

The show will utilize the Region X Tag Manager system. You must obtain a Region X shower number to participate by going to: www.RegionXNation.com and following the links.

Each entrant must provide a printed copy of their horse list prior to the start of the show.

Registration

Show Format and Eligibility

TRXC is championship show, so the format is a little bit different from what you may have experienced at other models shows. There are two different types of classes: Stakes and Maiden. It is very important to understand how to enter these classes so please read the following rules carefully.

All Open show Halter classes (both Stakes and Maiden) are double judged. In stakes your model will only be judged for the aspect(s) that it has cards for and the stewards will request your model be placed on the table appropriately with models with only Breed cards towards one end, only Workmanship/Collectability towards the other end and models with both types of cards in the middle. EXCEPTION: "Other Plastic" (non-Breyer) Collectability will be held in a different ring later in the show - Other Plastic should enter the Breed class in the main OF Plastic Halter ring and hold Collectability cards until the separate classes.

Performance entrants are reminded that set-ups are a Maximum of 18"x30". The tables at this event are 24"x72" which means 2 entries per table – be sure that your entry is set up at either end of the table to allow for 2 entries per table. Any entries that are set up in the middle of the table may be asked to move or be disqualified – note that Harness is an exception to this and may take up more space (within reason).

Stakes Classes

The Stakes classes are the TRXC championship classes. To enter a Stakes class your model must have a qualifying card from placing 1st or 2nd in a corresponding class at a Region 10 open show in 2017, 2018, 2019, 2021, 2022, or 2023. You will need to place the qualifying card next to your horse on the table when entering a Stakes class. In halter, models may have a Breed card, a Workmanship/Collectability card or both – in the double judged format the model will only be judged in the division corresponding to the card(s) presented – for example, a CM model with a Breed card will ONLY be judged for Breed (not Workmanship as it had not qualified). Stewards will check the cards to confirm that your model is qualified and in the correct Stakes class. You can find your personalized list of models qualified for TRXC by logging into your Tag Manager account at www.RegionXNation.com. Be sure to select whether you plan to compete in Open or Novice for an accurate list.

Maiden Classes

Maiden classes are open to models not currently eligible to compete in the Stakes classes. Maiden classes will be placed 1st-6th with the 1st and 2nd placed models eligible to enter the appropriate Stakes class. Models that have current NAN cards but not TRXC qualifications (i.e. new purchases, out of region showers, etc.) may show in the Maiden classes. In Halter, models with ANY TRXC card of ANY type

MAY NOT show in Maiden. In Performance, models may enter Maiden performance classes they are not currently qualified in, even if they have another performance qualification already. For example, if your model is qualified for western trail but not western pleasure, it may enter the Maiden Western Pleasure class, but not the Maiden Western Trail class.

Novice Division

The eligibility for Stakes and Maiden classes is the same as the open show, with one very important clarification: If a shower is entered in Novice that shower's models may ONLY show in novice – NO models may show in open, regardless of qualification. For example, if a shower primarily shows Novice and is entering Novice at TRXC but tried one open show and has a model with an Open TRXC card, that model may not show in Open and may only show in Novice Stakes if it also has a Novice TRXC card. An open TRXC card is NOT a qualification for a Novice TRXC class. The only classes that a Novice Entrant may enter are the Novice classes (starting with NV) and the only color cards allowed in those classes are Red, Purple, & Orange. Please see additional Novice guidance at the end of the show packet.

Limits & Times

Maiden Performance Classes: 2 models per class per shower

Maiden Original Finish Plastic Halter Classes: 2 models per class per shower – additional models \$1 each

All Other Maiden Halter Classes: 3 models per class per shower

Stakes Classes: Showers may show as many qualified models as they wish in the Stakes classes, but please be mindful of your own abilities to get models to the rings in a timely fashion.

IMPORTANT: Classes are planned to take approximately 10 minutes per halter class and 15 minutes per performance class. There are 2 sets of rings and an overflow ring for each division. One class will be judged in one ring while the next is being set up in the other ring, with overflow used if need be.

Performance classes will be held for 5 minutes after the completion of judging to allow for horse/tack changes beyond the 15 minutes if needed. PLEASE do not bring more than you can set up in 10 or 15 minutes. The ring stewards may use timers to ensure that all entries are set up (and removed) in a timely manner – please plan your show string appropriately.

The class lists are set up so that classes after the “Classes after this point will not start before 1:00 pm” will not start before 1:00 pm. This allows people to plan arrival time if they are only showing in classes after that point. While the classes before that point may not finish before 1:00, the ones below are guaranteed to not start before 1:00, regardless of when the earlier classes finish.

Awards

Maiden classes will be pinned 1st-6th with custom business card “flat ribbons”. First and second place models will receive Region X qualifier cards.

In the Open Stakes classes, each Champion and Reserve will receive a rosette and a blue Region X ticket that may be used toward Region X Achievement Awards. Top Honors models will receive certificates.

The number of Top Honors will be awarded based on class size as follows:

Less than 5 entries – Only Champion and Reserve Champion

5-9 entries - Champion, Reserve Champion, One Top Honor

10-15 entries - Champion, Reserve Champion, Three Top Honors

16+ entries - Champion, Reserve Champion, Five Top Honors

Awards for Champion and Reserve in Novice Stakes classes will consist of rosettes potentially from previous model horse show events with Top Honors receiving certificates per the schedule shown above.

The show holders reserve the right to combine or split classes depending on entry numbers to ensure fair competition (although this is unlikely).

NAMSHA Member Show

TRXC is a NAMHSA member show! Models placing first and second in the Open Maiden classes only will receive NAN cards and Region X cards. Maiden classes are only open to models not currently qualified for TRXC Stakes classes.

Raffle

A benefit raffle to support the show will be held both days. Any and all donations are welcome!! Nice OF models, custom models, gift certificates, obstacles, live show quality tack, etc will be greatly appreciated. If you have anything you would like to donate, please tell the show coordinator.

Other Rules

- No radios, pets, or smoking will be allowed in the show hall.
- Bad sportsmanship and poor conduct will not be tolerated, and may be cause for dismissal from the show hall.
 - The show coordinators, judges, and venue cannot be held responsible for any loss, damage, theft or injury to participants, their property, or their guests.
- Children/minor attendees must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times.
- The decision of the judges is final. If you have questions regarding your entry, please speak to the judge immediately after the class is pinned, while the judge's memory is still fresh.

Novice Show General Information (ONLY applies to Novice entrants)

Types of Models

Original Finish Plastic (aka OFP): Models made of plastic that have been bought from a factory company, with no alterations to the color or finish. Minor touch ups to fix rubs, if they are discreet, are allowable, but no other changes are permitted.

Custom (aka CM): Models that have been altered from their factory state. These may be simple or extensive changes. Generally custom models are done from plastic horses, but those made using porcelain/china horses or factory-produced resins can also count as customs.

Artist Resin (aka AR): Models made of resin that tend to be highly detailed, and are sold in generally small casting amounts by independent artists or hobby casting firms. These are offered either unpainted (and painted later by another artist) or painted by the sculpting artist. Artist resins are also sometimes customized.

What Can Show Where

Performance: Original Finish Plastic, Custom, and Artist Resin models. Props, tack, and models may be created by the exhibitor or another person.

Collectability: Original Finish Plastic models only, including all Special Runs.

Workmanship: Custom and Artist Resin models only. Models may have been created by the exhibitor or another person.

Breed: Original Finish Plastic models only. Any Special Runs must be editions of 350 pieces or more.

Note: This show is for model equids ONLY. This includes all horses, donkeys, mules, zebras, onagers etc.

Fantasy equid models (unicorn, pegasus, etc) may be shown in Collectability and Workmanship classes only.

What to Expect in the Divisions

Performance

This division focuses on a “snapshot” moment of a real horse event. Tack, props, and sometimes footing are used to make the setup realistic. The most important aspect is the fit of the tack; would it be safe for the horse and rider, is it accurate for the event that is being depicted? Scale and accuracy of props is also considered. For your setup, you will need a printed description card/paper explaining what the horse is doing. For example, a dressage entry might say “Horse is executing a flying lead change at X” and include a copy of a test (at the appropriate level for the tack the horse is wearing and the move it is attempting) that includes that movement. Performance classes will be judged in the order shown on the classlist. Showers must set up for the next class while the current class is being judged. Classes will only be held for 5 minutes for props, tack, or models, so please plan accordingly. Once you are done setting up your entry, place an “X” next to it (these will be on the tables) so the judge may begin to look at entries in order to keep the show moving.

Workmanship

This division is focused on artistry, detail, and accuracy of customization and finish work. Documentation is encouraged for unusual colors or poses.

Collectability

Models here are judged on condition, age, rarity, desirability, and the judge’s overall impression. If your model is not a Breyer (Peter Stone, Copperfox, Hartland, etc.), it must show in the Other Manufacturer class. If your horse is a Breyer, determine if it is a Regular or Special run. Regular Runs are listed in the yearly catalogs and are available from Breyer dealers or from Breyer’s website. Special Runs are available only from one or a couple of sources. For example, the Midstates specials are only available to a handful of stores located in the midwest. Regular Runs are classified into several classes based on what year they were released. Special Runs are classified by amount made and source.

www.identifyyourbreyer.com is an excellent resource for helping to find out what types of models you have. Documentation is required, such as an index card with: the model’s issue name (what it came with, not what you named it), years made, how many made (if known), and Special run source (if applicable) is generally what is needed. If your model has a Certificate or card of authenticity, you may present that, along with any other accessories the model might have come with (within reason, please do not take up too much space). Mirrors are allowed for models with numbers or signatures on the belly. Vintage boxes (Pre-1980’s/Yellow window boxes) may be displayed with the model, however please note that models must be outside of the package for judging.

Important Note: Breyer Special Runs of less than 350 pieces may ONLY enter the Collectability Division, NOT the breed division.

Breed

This is the most common type of classes you will see at shows. In Open (experienced) level classes, many divisions are judged for breed type. Here, we will focus on OF Plastic since it is the most popular type of model horse. Models are judged on realism (would this be a real and functioning horse if it was alive), and accuracy of breed assignment (how well does the horse match the breed standard). For example, a Palomino colored "Arabian" horse cannot be a purebred as the color does not exist in the breed, so you'd have to find a breed to cross with that has Palomino genes. Documentation is recommended for unusual breeds, colors, and crossbreds.
